## **About the Landworkers' Alliance**

The Landworkers' Alliance (LWA) is a union of farmers, growers, foresters and land-based workers operating across the UK. # About the Land Skills Fair - a festival for food, land and climate justice

At its heart the Land Skills Fair is a multigenerational and multicultural skills and knowledge exchange that aims to provide a safe space for everyone to learn from each other and explore different land-based topics and practices.

The event is member-led, with the majority of the skills, workshops and talks being offered through members of the Landworkers' Alliance, Land in Our Names, FLAME and other partner unions and organisations.

Between 21-24 July there will be workshops, talks, activities, music and delicious food and drink. The Land Skills Fair is an opportunity to build the Food and Land Justice movement through a diverse, celebratory and creative space.

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We are committed to our <u>Equality and Diversity Statement</u> and we welcome and encourage applications from anyone interested in this role who feels they have the relevant experience and skills. We would like to particularly encourage those from under represented and marginalised groups to consider applying for this role.

The use of a personal computer and phone is required for this role. If this poses a challenge for you we encourage you to get in touch (contact details below) as we do not wish this to be a barrier to applying.

## Role overview and job description:

We need an enthusiastic and committed Volunteer Coordinator to work with the Land Skills Fair Team on delivery of the volunteer programme for the Land Skills Fair event in Gloucestershire, 21-24 July 2022.

As Volunteer Coordinator you will play a key role at the Land Skills Fair coordinating and managing the needs of the festival volunteer team. During the festival you will manage the volunteers with the support of the Land Skills Fair Team correlating shifts and rotas for the different volunteer teams, making sure absences are covered and volunteers are cared for. You will be responsible for briefing the volunteers about the programme and health and safety procedures with support and training from the Land Skills Fair team.

Volunteer roles for the event include: Stewards, Decor, Site crew, Bar, Kitchen and Programming. There will be approximately 150 volunteers on site for the event, most doing 2 x 6 hour shifts each. The Volunteer Coordinator will be responsible for around  $\frac{2}{3}$  of this total, with the remainder managed by other members of the Land Skills Fair team. The Volunteer Coordinator will need to support volunteers to navigate the site and make sure they know where they are supposed to be, distribute meal tokens and tickets and make sure they understand their roles and responsibilities.

We may be in a position to offer a similar role for another LWA event: the People's Food Summit 2022, 16- 18 September in Gloucestershire. This is to be confirmed and will be discussed at interview.

#### Specific responsibilities of this role will be:

• Be the primary point of contact for all volunteers and volunteer enquiries

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immediately before and during the event.

- Organise and deliver face to face volunteer briefings inc Health and Safety. Training support will be given in advance.
- Manage the volunteers throughout the festival, through face-to-face contact, email and phone.
- Coordinate the detailed volunteer schedule and rota.
- Record volunteer attendance and completion of shifts.
- Support volunteers and offer advice where necessary.
- Contribute to the post-festival evaluation process and reporting by hosting simple, daily debrief sessions with volunteers and coordinating the gathering of feedback before volunteers leave site on the last day.
- Work to ensure effective and safe working practices are implemented at all times in line with LWA policies.

#### **Person Specification:**

We hope to appoint someone for this role who has the following skills and experiences:

- Enthusiastic with the ability to enthuse others too
- Friendly, approachable and considerate
- Experience of managing volunteers (ideally in a festival setting)
- Knowledge of and passion for grassroots movement building
- Experience of working at festivals
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Excellent time management and organisational skills
- A passion and demonstrable commitment to movement led change for food sovereignty and agroecology
